Dear Family & Friends of Woodmar,

Grace and peace to you in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ!

Happy New Year! Yes, Advent is the beginning of the new year on the Christian calendar. (Advent began on November 27th.) Just as the new year that we celebrate as a culture (January 1st) ushers in opportunities to re-evaluate our lives and life choices, Advent gives us the opportunity to spend time reflecting on our faith journeys.

During this season, the world screams at us, "Buy more! Decorate more! Charge more on your credit card...you can always pay it off later! Be busy! There's no time to be still to prepare your hearts for Christmas! There are things that MUST BE DONE OR YOU WON'T BE READY!" - Approve curriculum
- Receive information from the director at each board meeting on the status of the program
- Oversee general operations
- · Communicate any major changes to operating procedures and facility to the Church Council for approval.

Victoria is enormously appreciative to Doraida Rivera, a friend of Pastor Esta and her husband Miguel Rosario's caring family. Victoria is thankful for experiencing the beautiful country and people. The effervescent spirit, pride, and tenacity expressed by those she met has made a lasting impression.

As small pockets of the resurgence of the pandemic continues, so does Victoria's enthusiasm to assist the school. Victoria accomplished her goal, made lifelong friends, and will continue to support the school and country.




Please pray for the families and friends of Jackie Kapetanovic and of Carl Moore. They both joined our Lord to spend

WOODMAR BOOK CLUB

REVERSE ADVENT



The January book is *The* Man Who Died Twice by Richard Osman.

An Advent calendar is a special calendar used to count the days in anticipation of Christmas Day. Since the date of the first Sunday of Advent varies, falling between Nov. 27 and Dec. 3, the Advent calendar usually begins on Dec 1. Usually there is a daily scripture reading and a piece of chocolate (or some other goodie) that one receives

while counting down the days till Christmas.

A Reverse Advent Calendar is where you give something daily instead of receive something daily. It works like this: each day you place an item, such as a non-perishable food item, toilet paper, tooth paste, etc. into a box for the food pantry at Hammond First UMC. What they MOST need are canned soups, cereals, oatmeal, and canned meals. What they do NOT want is canned fish, canned vegetables and dried fruit. When you come to church on Christmas Eve you bring in your box. The boxes will be loaded up and taken to Hammond First to help stock their food pantry. We have done this for several years and it has been highly successful and very much appreciated. Thank you for your generosity!
