I have gotten to spend some time talking with some of you already. I look forward to meeting with all of you to discuss your vision for the ministry of Woodmar UMC. Until then, let me answer the question that many of you are probably thinking. What does this talk of merger between Hammond First and Woodmar actually mean?

Let me begin with there is no proposal for a merger on the table at this time. The Conference has appointed me as your Pastor on a part time basis while you, the Congregation, discern how God is calling you to be the church in this community going forward and what could that look like if Woodmar and Hammond First were to merge as one congregation.

To that end both churches have agreed to establish a joint committee to try to answer that question and then to make recommendations to each individual congregation. There is nothing, at this time, that has been decided. Hammond First is selling their parsonage located in Munster as the pastor that is now appointed at Hammond First will commute from his house in Winfield. That is the only decision they have made at this time.

You have appointed Cyndi Slaboski, Mary Zaikis, and Nancy Craig, to represent you in the discussions that will take place over the rest few months. Recommendations will be made to you but you as the congregation will have final approval over any proposal.

Over the next few weeks I am looking to hold a town hall meeting for the Congregation in order to answer whatever questions you may have. Until then, I look forward to working with all of you to bring new growth to this congregation.

The nonprofit was formed in honor of Brianna DiBattiste, a young woman who, despite living a seemingly normal life, developed a severe heroin addiction. One night in June 2014, she left home to meet a "friend" and never came home. Three months later, her body was found. Her mother had found a note that Brianna had written, in which she cried out to God for a better life for herself and her family. These words inspired the formation of this support group.

## What is Scrip?

We are all familiar with gift cards. Scrip is a "gift card" that you purchase at the church rather than at a store. When you purchase a card, you pay the same amount as the value of the card. The church makes a percentage of that value. You can find lists of what cards are available on the counter by the church office. We don't carry everything in stock, but can have it for you in a week. Cyndi Slaboski or Nancy Tatum can sell you cards on Sunday; Debbie and Nancy can any weekday the office is open (10AM to 1PM).

#### **FINANCES**

February ended on a positive note. We had income over expenses of \$1,042. This is mainly due to the fact that we no longer have Pastor's full salary, pension or insurance costs. We have approximately \$34,000 in cash. Nothing unusual for the month! Community Preschool also had a good month with income over expenses of \$9,490. They have \$145,000 cash in bank, \$47,216 is the balance of the Stabilization Grant. March will end our Capital Campaign of 2020!
