I serve on the Board of Ordained Ministry on their Executive committee and have the privilege of interviewing candidates for ministry. The words from one candidate struck a nerve. Hear these words. "One of the biggest challenges for the Church today is that we can become fixated on keeping "insiders" happy and maintaining methods and traditions than no longer create the welcoming space we are called to be. We overly focus on nurturing the committed and forget about the mission of loving those who are not. WE hold on tightly to programs and events that have worked in the past even if they are no longer connecting us to new people."

There is a lot to unpack in those words. I believe that the churches in Hammond, and particularly Woodmar United Methodist Church, have a lot of offer to this community and working together we can make a difference. The District has a motto, "Stronger Together". I look forward to meeting all of you and, together, begin to once again make a difference in this community.

Dear Woodmar Family and Friends,

Rev. Marti Lundy, our North District Superintendent, attended our monthly Church Council on February 16. We learned that First United Methodist Church in Hammond (on Hohman Avenue) is looking into merging with our church. They are selling their parsonage and the newly merged church would be in our building. Our preschool/daycare would continue as usual, as would many of our other programs/events.

First Church, like us, is undergoing a shrinking congregation and serious financial difficulties. If we were to merge, our combined congregations would be supporting one building, one set of utilities, one parsonage, one pastor with his/her insurance and pension benefits. Together we could expand existing ministries and start new ones. We could make an even bigger difference in our community! Rev. Lundy said she is excited about this possible merger. Paul Arnold (Assistant District Superintendent) would also be assisting us. She asked the council if we wanted to officially begin the process to **explore** this merger. All twelve members that were present voted an enthusiastic "yes."

Rev. Lundy explained the procedure to us. Our new pastor (Pete Ward) and three members from our church will meet with their pastor (Jim Denton) and three members from First Church to explore details of the merger. There will be plenty of opportunities for everyone in both churches to learn what is happening and voice concerns. There is no time table for this process. When we are ready, each church will have an all-church vote. Both churches will have to vote "yes" for the merger to happen.

The Church Council choose our three church representatives for the exploration meetings. They are Nancy Craig, Cyndi Slaboski, and Mary Zaikis. Other council members will provide information/advice when needed. Feel free to talk with our three representatives or Pastor Pete any time you have questions or concerns.

Jim Denton, current pastor at Hammond First, would probably become the pastor of our newly merged church. Pete Ward, who came out of retirement to pastor us, would go back into retirement. Jim's wife, Sheri, is also a United Methodist pastor at Hobart Trinity and Michigan Avenue United Methodist Churches. They have a home in Hobart. Rev. Lundy didn't know if they would choose to live in our parsonage or stay in Hobart. Either way, she suggested that we keep the parsonage because the next pastor may need it.

Change is often difficult and there will probably be some anxiety as we go through the process. The congregation at First Church will, of course, be going through much bigger changes and we need to be sensitive to this. Often the biggest sticking point in a merger is what building to use. We are grateful that First Church made this difficult decision before they even approached us.

We are in the beginning stages, so there are many things that we don't know yet. At this point, both churches are exploring how this might work. As we learn more, we will make sure this information is passed on to you. Meanwhile, one thing we can all do is pray about it and seek God's will!

Alex faces the ultimate test: how do you outmaneuver a brilliant psychopath?



COMMUNITY PRESCHOOL & CHILDCARE

Have you met Karianne Padilla? Karianne first came to Community Preschool and Childcare as a practicum student completing her Associate's Preschool & Childcare Degree in Early Childhood. As a mature and dynamic practicum student, Karianne stood out as someone we hoped to keep on our staff. Four years ago, Cyndi Slaboski expressed the need to bring on an assistant director that would move into the director role. Karianne was hired as assistant director and has been taking on the increasing responsibilities of a director. In addition, Karianne began an accelerated Bachelor's degree program in Early Childhood administration at Indiana Wesleyan College. This week, Karianne completed the requirements for her Bachelor's degree!

Congratulations Karianne for your perseverance and excellence in completing your bachelor's degree while working full time, being a mom to Ariele and wife to Roy. Over the past four years, Karianne has navigated our program through COVID, assisted with the NAEYC accreditation, taken on the responsibility of the Child and Adult Care Food Program (a federal program) and manages the increased enrollment of children receiving financial assistance from Indiana's CCDF and On My Way Pre-K. Karianne is an advocate for our staff and is masterful at arranging staff schedules to meet the many regulations of child care. Throughout each day, Karianne moves through the classrooms to assist with challenging behaviors and to positively encourage each child and teacher. Karianne greets each parent and engages each one with a heartfelt sense of trust and belonging in Christian love.

Now, the director transition can be completed. The policies for Community Preschool and Childcare, and the standards for our accreditation from NAEYC or National Association for the Education of Young Children, determine that the director should have a bachelor's degree in early childhood education or a related field. By summer, an assistant director will come onboard to manage some of the administrative tasks and Cyndi will move to an "as needed" role of guidance. God's hand has been evident throughout this process. It has been a journey of peaks, valleys and level ground. I am grateful for the solid foundation that Community Preschool and Childcare provides for our community. To God be the Glory! With gratitude,
