Dear Family & Friends of Woodmar,

Grace and peace to you in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ!

If you're on social media, you know that Facebook asks every day: "What's on your mind?" My answer this Lenten season is family. Biological family. Church family. The family of God. I am truly grateful for family on so many levels.

First and foremost, I am thankful that Jesus brought us into the family of God. That was the point of the incarnation...Jesus came because, "¹⁶ God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life. ¹⁷ For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world through Him might be saved." (John 3:16-17) You've heard the expression "Blood is thicker than water?" I used to think that meant that the bond in a biological family is the closest bond humans can have, but the meaning is actually deeper than that. The full saying is "the blood of the covenant is thicker than the water of the womb." In other words, the bond we have through the blood of Christ is stronger than our biological familial bonds.

As we journey a couple more weeks in Lent reflecting on the sacrifices Jesus made for us and reflecting on our own discipleship, I pray that we will be encouraged and strengthened in knowing that because of Jesus' great sacrifice and his victory over sin and death, we are part of the family of God. We can be confident of this good news!

Secondly, I am thankful for my biological family. Olivia and I just took a trip out west. We flew into San Diego, then drove to Yuma, AZ to spend time with Delaney, Ricardo, and Pancake. It was such a blessing to see them in their home environment. Delaney is a CRU missionary, and we were able to participate in a ministry project she's leading while we were there. CRU has partnered with "Helping Hands," an organization that provides needed services to the elderly: they grocery shop for them, provide transportation to medical appointments, and generally encourage them.




PLEASE PRAY THIS PRAYER EVERY DAY:

Last but not least, I am thankful for our Woodmar family. What a beautiful family we have! When friends or family from other places have worshiped with us, they go on and on about how welcoming and loving our church family is! I concur! What a blessing you are to our family and to the neighborhood!

May the Holy Spirit strengthen and renew our family connections.



INTENTIONAL FAITH DEVELOPMENT



COMMUNITY PRESCHOOL & CHILDCARE

As Spring comes and the transmission rate of COVID lessens, our enrollment increases. Our two youngest classrooms are now at their maximum enrollment. Pre-K classes have room for growth. The preschool year will wind down in May yet, summer preschool opportunities and full time care will be available. We are excited to bring back our class for two year olds this summer and fall.

April 4-8, is the Week of the Young Child with special plans for each day of the week to highlight early learning. On Music Monday, Pastor Esta will visit each class to lead special music. On Thursday evening, 5-7 pm, families are invited to an open house Reading Night. Each classroom will highlight early literacy activities, a representative from the Hammond Public Library will be present to share resources, pizza will be served in the Narthex, Woodmar UMW Reading Buddies will highlight their Kiki's Hats project, Scholastic books will be given to each child and a representative from On My Way Pre-K will be present with scholarship information and Kickstart Kindergarten resources from IN Department of Education.

Our program had an annual inspection from the Indiana Family and Social Services Administration that focuses on health and safety regulations. Our program had no violations.

Thanks to the second grant that Community Preschool and Childcare received from the COVID Rescue Plan and in coordination with the Trustees we have reached out to Randy DeVries of Site Services to evaluate the repair needs of the north parking lot. The south lot will be evaluated too and options will be given. Site Services did the parking lot at the YMCA and has worked with many churches.



FINANCES

February ended on a negative of \$8,000 with \$17,600 cash on hand. We have received 30 Pledge Cards (sent out 105) totaling \$53,000 allocated to Current Expense. Community Preschool had a positive month of \$6,700. They received a second Stabilization Grant on February 16 for \$129,079, which can be used thru September 2023. This will help keep the Preschool operating as our enrollment numbers slowly increase to pre COVID 19! The Capital Campaign balance is currently at \$59,300.
